

Timanfaya's National Park



alf submerged in a sea of lava and close to Timanfaya's National Park, Mancha Blanca Visiting and Interpreting Centre is a welcome centre that provides information and develops interpretative activities for all the visitors to the Park. With a surface of 2,293 square meters, the Centre spreads across the main building and other adjacent structures, giving tourists the opportunity to appreciate the natural resources of the Park.



Exhibition room

The Permanent Exhibition of Mancha Blanca Visitors Centre is a must-see for those who want to have a thorough knowledge of the volcanic phenomena of Timanfaya. The exhibition occupies various rooms, each equipped with different interpretative resources such as backlit panels, miniatures, interactive screens, etc. that in a simple and clear way prepare visitors for the visit to the Park.

Lanzarote's Protected Areas, the internal structure of the Earth, geodynamic, volcanism and the origin of Canary Islands are some of the themes treated within the exhibition.

The exhibition is also equipped with an Instrumentation Room, an element of great importance for the volcanic research activities carried out in the Park. It is also possible to see a simulation of a volcanic eruption, in which visitors can experience a situation similar to the one that the inhabitants of Lanzarote faced at the time of the last eruptions.





Screening room

The Centre is equipped with a screening room with four different audiovisuals: a diaporama with an accompanying special soundtrack, a documentary on Timanfaya's National Park and two audiovisuals on volcanism and life in Timanfaya.



Access rules

The Centre opening hours are from 09:00am to 05:00pm all year round.

For organised groups the Direction of the Timanfaya's National Park reserves the right to establish an advance access appointment system to the facilities in order to guarantee a homogeneous distribution of visits.

- The use of cameras is allowed for personal use only.
- No animals, with the exception of guide dogs, are allowed inside the facilities.
- Professional activities are not allowed within the Visitors Centre.
- The consumption of food or drinks, with the exception of baby food, is strictly prohibited within the Centre.

Other facilities

Mancha Blanca Visitors and Interpreting Centre has a library with a complete selection of books related to Timanfaya's National Park, Lanzarote and the Canary Islands.

The Centre has a panoramic balcony from which visitors can admire what they have previously seen in the videos and panels.

There is also a comfortable walkway with disabled access that allows visitors to submerge themselves in the volcanic flow.

Mancha Blanca Visitors Centre also has a bookshop, located at the entrance of the main building, and a parking area that can accommodate 57 cars and 5 buses.

In order to enjoy your visit, Mancha Blanca Visitors and Interpreting Centre recommends:

- In the interest of all visitors, please observe silence while visiting the exhibition.
- Do not touch anything and make appropriate use of the facilities.
