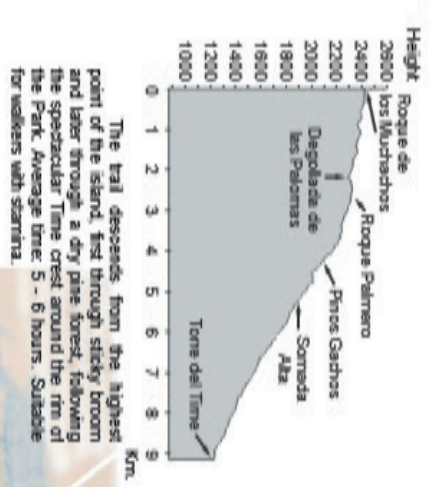
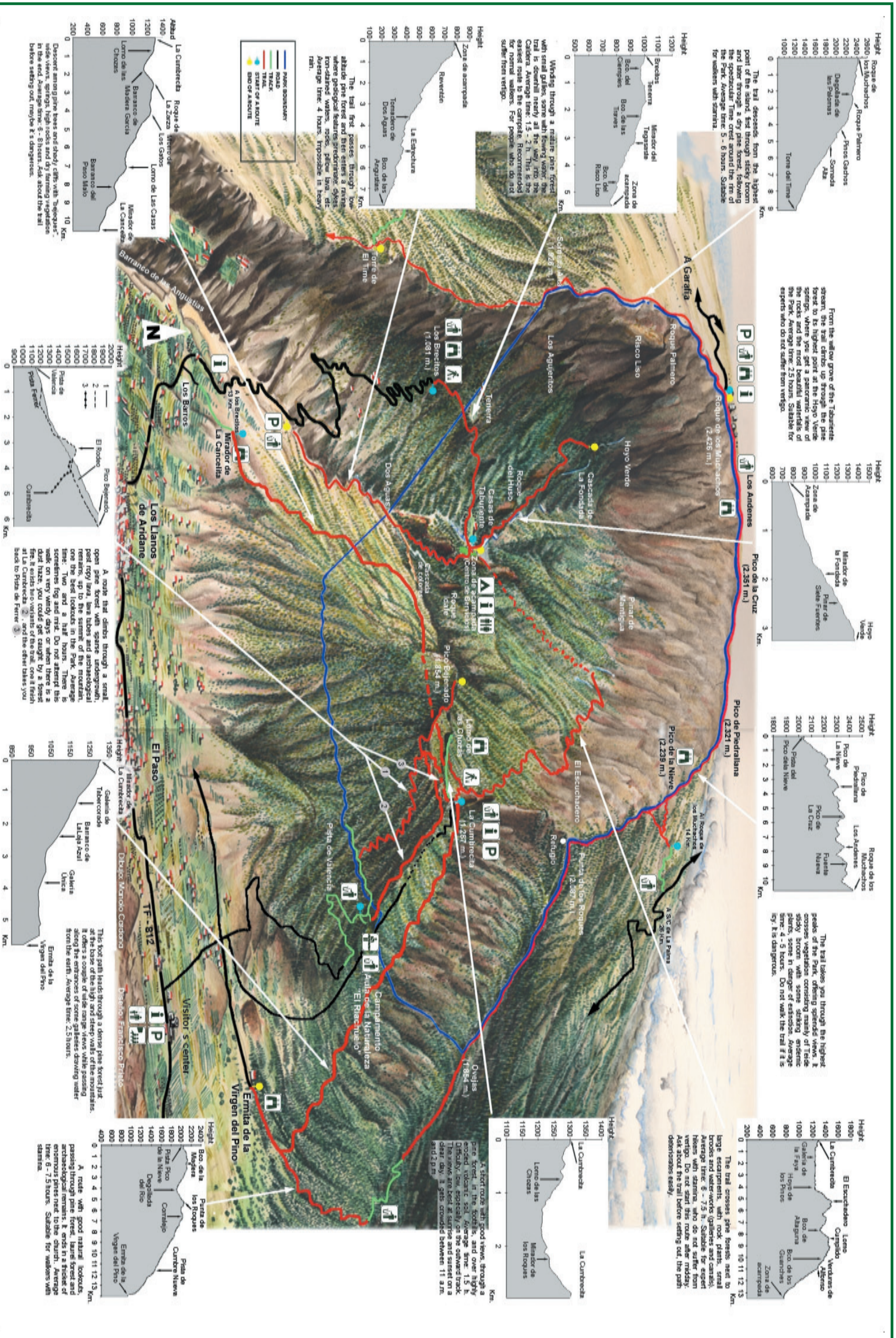
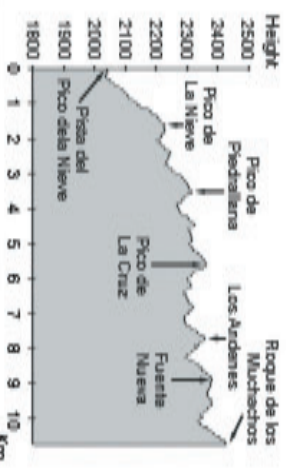
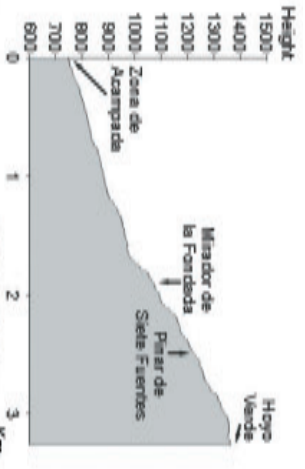


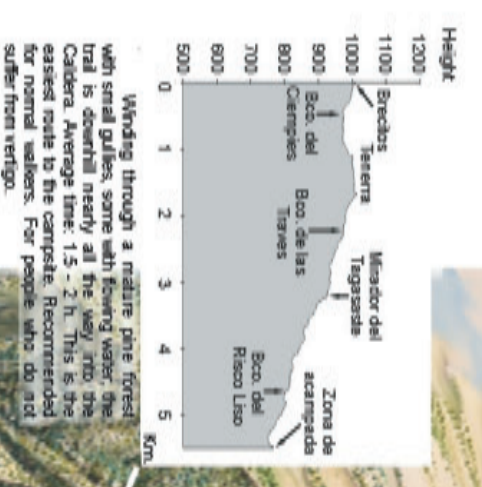
Trails in the Taburiente Crater National Park



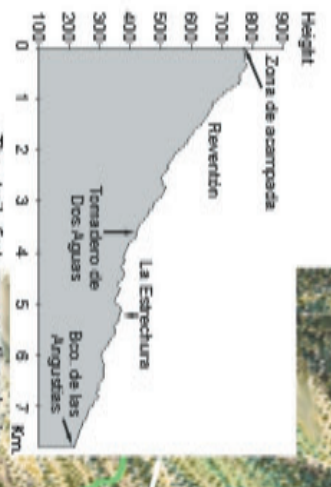
The trail descends from the highest point of the island, first through sticky broom and later through a dry pine forest, following the spectacular rim crest around the rim of the Park. Average time: 5 - 6 hours. Suitable for walkers with stamina.



The trail takes you through the highest peaks of the Park, offering splendid views. It crosses vegetation consisting mainly of Teide-sticky-brown with some striking endemic plants, some in danger of extinction. Average time: 4 - 5 hours. Do not walk the trail if it is icy. It is dangerous.



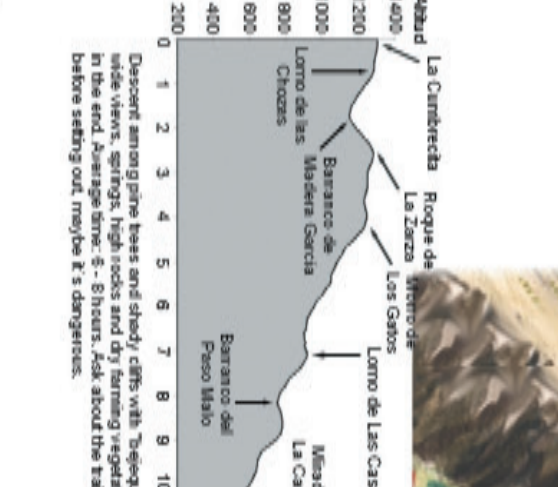
Whirling through a mature pine forest with small gullies, some with flowing water, the trail is downhill nearly all the way into the Caldera. Average time: 1.5 - 2 h. This is the easiest route to the crater. Recommended for normal walkers. For people who do not suffer from vertigo.



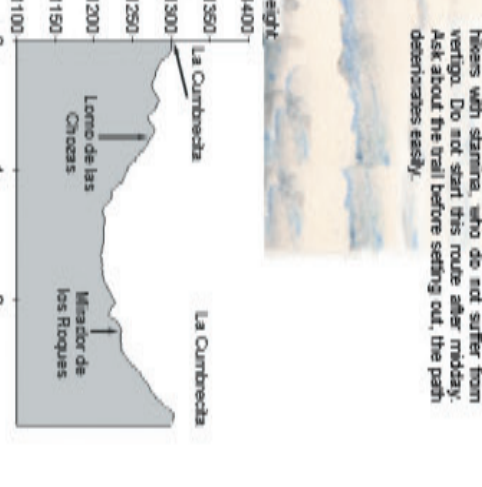
The trail first passes through low altitude pine forest and then enters a ravine where geological features predominate: gullies, iron-stained waters, rocks, pillow lava, etc. Average time: 4 hours. Impossible in heavy rain.



Descend among pine trees and shady cliffs with "teigues" wide views, springs, high rocks and dry farming vegetation in the end. Average time: 5 - 8 hours. Ask about the trail before setting out, maybe it's dangerous.



A route that climbs through a small, open pine forest with sparse undergrowth, past rocky lava, lava tubes and archaeological remains, up to the summit of the mountain, one of the best lookouts in the Park. Average time: Two and a half hours. There is sometimes fog and mist. Do not attempt this walk on very windy days or when there is a dust haze, you could get caught by a forest fire. It ends two variants of the trail, one at La Cumbrecha (2) and the other takes you back to Pista de Ferrer (3).



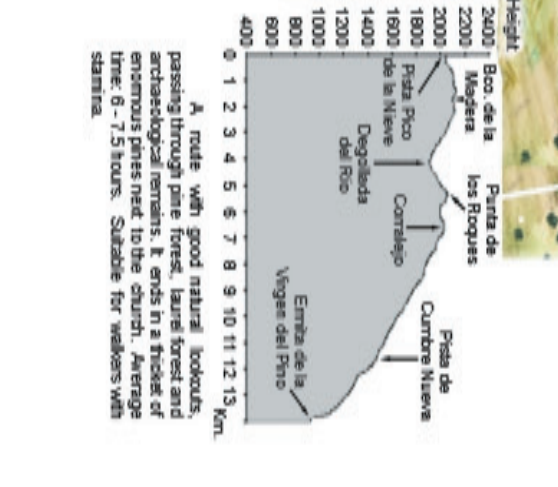
A short route with good views, through a pine forest in the foothills, and over highly eroded volcanic soil. Average time: 1.5 h. Difficult, low especially on the outward track. The views are best at sunrise and sunset on a clear day. It gets crowded between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.



A route with good natural lookouts, passing through pine forest, laurel forest and archaeological remains. It ends in a flock of enormous pines next to the church. Average time: 6 - 7.5 hours. Suitable for walkers with stamina.



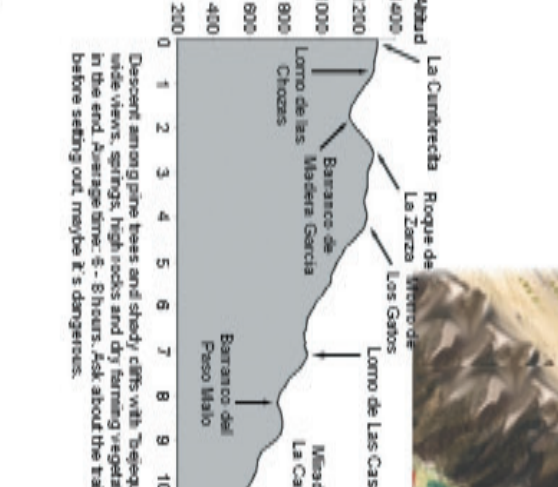
This foot path heads through a dense pine forest just at the base of the high and steep walls of the mountain. It offers a couple of wide range views while passing along the entrances of some gullies drawing water from the earth. Average time: 2.5 hours.



A route with good natural lookouts, passing through pine forest, laurel forest and archaeological remains. It ends in a flock of enormous pines next to the church. Average time: 6 - 7.5 hours. Suitable for walkers with stamina.



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
